PREFACE.

The following arrangement of texts, was undertaken, as the title page intimates, at the request of a friend. As many other friends, wishing for a copy, have urged the printing of them, and as the compiler feels considerable repugnance to appear before the public on such a subject, she has consented to print a number for private circulation among those who desire to have their minds led to a scriptural view of the subject, rather than to lengthened dissertations of man's writing. No apology is made for defects or deficiencies, as the book is intended only for those who have expressed a wish to possess it.

There is nothing original in the work; it is merely an arrangement of scripture texts; at the same time, as it is evident that texts may be so classified as to give the views of man, rather than a fair representation of scripture truth as a whole, the Compiler

earnestly entreats her friends to read and judge for themselves; and thankful will she be for any remarks or suggestions either for or against her expressed views of the subject. All she desires is, to get at the mind of the Spirit of God, and not to give any ideas of her own.

Many dear friends, who desire to look into these glorious subjects, are often at a loss how to begin. This classification of texts, therefore, is intended simply to lead them to the FOUNTAIN OF TRUTH; and by putting together such texts as appear to throw light on each other, to help them to form a judgment on the truths laid down.

May the Spirit of Truth, the great Teacher of the Church of God, guide them into all the truth, and lead them to watch for the approach of the Heavenly Bridegroom, having their lamps trimmed and burning brightly when the cry shall be heard, "Behold, the Bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet Him."


The texts have not been printed in full, on
