P. 3. Add to description of Jaquet arms *le tout d'argent*.

P. 17. Lions should have been placed as supporters instead of leopards in the arms of Pierre de Jaquet (189). Lions are often called leopards in heraldry.

P. 64. *Eschenbach* instead of *Eschenboch*.

P. 73. Peter Jaquet (332) married Susanna Jenis, as appears by the reference to her second marriage: Married April 6, 1636, Mr. Hans Jacob Beer, a young man from Augsburg, Germany, and Madam Susanna Jenis, widow of Pieter Jaquet from Amsterdam, both now residing here in the City of The Hague (Marriage Register, Archives of the City of The Hague, Holland).

April 22, 1655, appeared before the undersigned notary Sir (Sieur) Hans Jacob Beer, citizen and jeweler at The Hague for Mrs. Susanna Jennis, his wife, who constituted Ludwig Vogel, Imperial Notary Public, attorney to sell and convey her share as heir in certain personalty remaining with Cross Brothers (Creutzbrüders) at Nürnberg, of which her sister has a third, and to deliver a deed for the same. Witnesses Guillame Gregoir and Govert van Hatten. Signed, Hans Jacob Beer. A. Beeckman, Notary Public. (Archives of the City of The Hague.)

June 1, 1665, appeared with witnesses the respected Mr. Hans Jacob Peer [Beer] and Mrs. Susanna Jenis, his wife, both residing at The Hague, who acknowledged having sold to Mr. Martinus Jacquet, Advocate for the Government, Provincial Court of Holland, all household goods, etc., for the sum of 400 corolus florins, the payment of which is acknowledged, and the parties desire me, a Notary, to draw and deliver an instrument in proper form. This done and passed for presentation to Mr. Phillips van der Oudenroggen and Jan Schuyrmans, Mr. Schoenmaecker, both members of the City Troop and residents of this City, for witnessing as requested.
