#### NOTE

THE author has experienced some difficulty in finding an appropriate title for the three stories and the two short plays which make up this little volume. The first appeared in 1895 in Cosmopolis, the second was printed in a child's annual called The Parade, and the third was a contribution to a Christmas number of The Saturday Review. play, "A Repentance," on its production at the St James's Theatre, received the highest encouragement from some critics, and no understanding at all from others. 
