## CHAPTER I.

### THE MEDICINE BOX.

The outfit of medicines and medical supplies furnished auxiliary vessels of the Navy having no medical officer or member of the Hospital Corps, consists of (a) one medicine box, Navy standard, and (b) a box of additional medical supplies in an ordinary packing case. The contents of these boxes with simple directions for their use are given below.
