

PREFACE.

The greater number of the books here catalogued belong to the collection made at La Rochelle before the year 1685, by Elie Bouhéreau, the first of Marsh's Librarians. These books are all in the Reading-room, here indicated by the letter R.

Elie Bouhéreau, who was one of the learned society of his day, had been a practising physician in his native town of La Rochelle. The French books in his library, therefore, include a considerable number of medical works, as well as of books of controversial theology. He had been in his youth a divinity student at Saumur; and, about 1702 or 1708, he took Orders in the Church of Ireland, and eventually became Precentor of St. Patrick's Cathedral. He died in 1719.

Some of the most valuable and interesting of the French books in Marsh's Library belong to the collection of Edward Stillingfleet, Bishop of Worcester (ob. 1699), which Archbishop Narcissus Marsh bought for the Public Library erected by him on the ground of the ancient archiepiscopal palace of St. Sepulchre, adjoining St. Patrick's Cathedral. The Library was incorporated in 1707; but the fabric had been erected, and Stillingfleet and Bouhéreau's books deposited in it, not later than 1704. Stillingfleet's books are in the cases lettered A, B 1, B 2, &c.

Some, but fewer, of the works catalogued here belong to Marsh's own collection of printed books, which came to the Library on his death, in 1713. These are in the cases lettered A 8, B 8, &c. Marsh bequeathed his valuable collection of Oriental ass. to the Bodleian Library. There are also a few among the books bequeathed by John Stearne, Bishop of Clogher, who died in 1745. These are in the cases lettered A 4, B 4, &c.

This catalogue contains no books printed after 1715. This limit has been fixed, because the death of Louis XIV marks the close of an epoch in the history of France. In any case, the four collections which constitute the main contents of Marsh's Library possessed hardly any books printed after that date.

Perhaps the most interesting entries in the catalogue are those under the heading Brochures, a remarkable collection of pamphlets

of the early part of the seventeenth century. There are also a considerable number of books of travel. These will be found under the head of Voyages and various place-names.

As regards the form of this catalogue, there are one or two points to which attention must be drawn. Anonymous works, and those whose authorship is indicated only by initials, have been entered, as far as possible, under the subject with which they deal. Thus, if they are of a historical nature, they will be found under the king to whose reign, by their subject-matter, they belong; or under the name of the country to the history of which they are a contribution.

In arranging the surnames of authors in alphabetical order, the prefix De has been ignored, except where it is compounded with La or Le, as part of a name. Thus D'Huisseau, De Scudery, De La Fontaine, are entered as Huisseau, d' : Scudéru, de : La Fontaine. de. But such names as Du Moulin and Des Hayes will be found in their places among those beginning with D. And such names as La Bruyere and Le Caron are placed among those beginning with L.

The letters I and J are, for index purposes, considered as different forms of the same letter; and the same view is taken of the letters U and V.

No attempt has been made to reproduce the exact punctuation, capitalization or accentuation (if any), of the titles of the books catalogued. On the other hand, I have endeavoured to present exactly the original spelling. And those who may consult this catalogue are asked to believe that the strange forms of some words in it are probably due to the author or the original printer rather than to the carelessness of the present compiler. In the preparation of a list such as this some unconscious blunders are perhaps inevitable; but I have aimed at accuracy, and I crave indulgence in the cases in which I have failed to attain it.

I have, in conclusion, to express my obligations to Mr. W. E. A. Moore, my courteous and efficient assistant, for enabling me to add the Appendix relating to the Cashel Collection, and for other help in the preparation of this catalogue.
