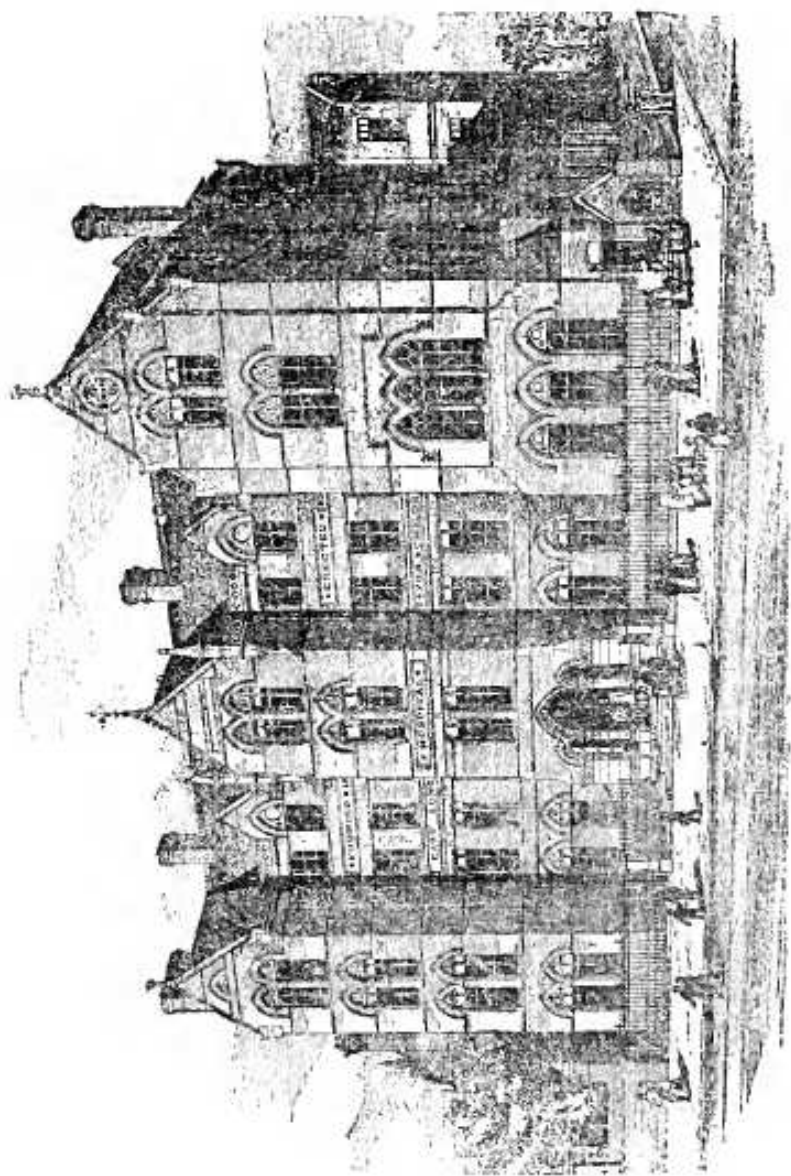

Privileges of Subscribers and Donors.

A Subscriber shall be entitled to recommend two Out-Patients annually for each guinea given to the Hospital. Donors of £10 10s. in one sum are Life Governors, and are entitled to recommend five Patients annually for life; and every recommendation shall be equivalent to an ordinary In-Patient's letter, if the case require it.

The Hospital contains 92 beds. The In-Patients are taken from the Out-Patients. They are selected on this principle: Is there a bed vacant? Is this the worst case of the day?—the admission being entirely at the discretion of the medical attendant.

The Out-patients attend with orders from Subscribers, who receive two letters or orders for each annual subscription of a guinea.

Special Cots are maintained according to the following scale:—

Scale of Amounts required for Endowment, or Support of Special Cots.

To endow a Cot in Perpetuity	£1,000
" " for Lifetime of Donor	300
" " by Annual Subscription	50

Such scale to be subject to modification under special circumstances brought before the Board.

N.B.—Accidents and urgent cases are admitted at any time, of any age, and without letters
