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PREFACE

ALL good teachers to-day seek to use the best literature as one of the most potent of educational means.

In the higher grades this is easily effected by means of reading matter in the hands of the children, but for the primary grades the task is much more difficult. Here suitable selections must be carefully made by the teacher and then read or recited to the children.

To make such selections wisely requires, in addition to the taste which comes from a wide acquaintance with good literature and access to good libraries, time to make the necessary researches. This requirement few teachers can meet. Hence some give up the task as impossible, while others use over and over again the few selections from standard authors which have become universally familiar, or, worse, employ poor or ephemeral material drawn from current periodicals.

This little list, which has been prepared with great care to supply partially the need of the overworked teacher, contains the names of stories and poems carefully graded, suitable for use in each of the primary grades. They are so classified also, that it will be easy to obtain selections suitable for correlation with the other subjects of the curriculum and for use upon special occasions, such as the various national holidays and in commemoration of events of historic interest. Many are also arranged with reference to the varying seasons of the year. It will not be necessary to repeat the stories or poems from grade to grade, as there is abundance of fresh material for each year and for every occasion.

While all of the selections are from the writings of standard authors, they have been chosen with reference to sources of supply, and it will be seen that most of them are found in books quite easily available, either in the regular editions of well-known authors, or in collections inexpensive and readily obtainable.

No one teacher will try to use more than a small portion of the selections here named. The number is purposely made large so that each teacher may easily obtain material enough for her use from some readily available source. To teachers who have no definite plan it is suggested that at least one poem a month be memorized by the children and that as many stories be used as can readily be adapted to the work and interests of the school.

It is suggested that in the lowest grades the teachers carefully prepare themselves and then tell the stories to the children, and as the grades advance that they read more and more to them in order that as rapidly as possible the children may be imbued with the spirit and style of the best authors.

These stories can then be told freely again by the children to the teacher, in the lower grades orally only, in the higher both orally and in writing. This exercise serves to fix them in the mind and, besides, constitutes an excellent language lesson. The poems should be memorized by the children and recited, never paraphrased. The recitation should be usually by individual children, rarely in concert.

Poems and stories should often be chosen with the view that they may serve to amplify and enrich other subjects of the curriculum.

If by means of this little book the labors of any teachers are lightened and the minds of even a few children enriched by the possession of some of the choice treasures of our noble literature, the authors will be satisfied.
