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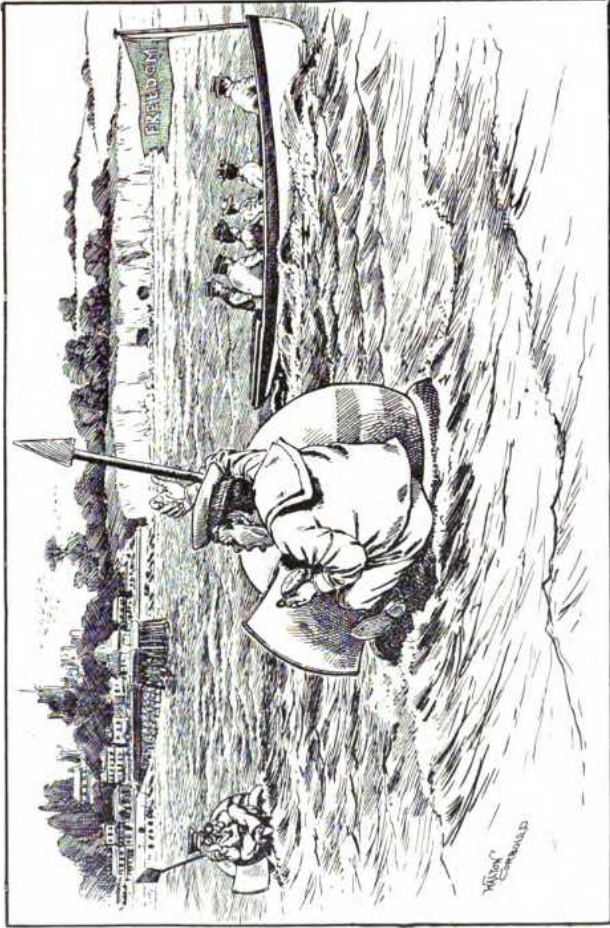

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PREFACE.

THE following pages are a slightly revised reprint of a series of articles on Marine Motors, which appeared in "THE YACHTSMAN" during the winter 1901-2.
