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PREFACE.

The firft, eighth, and ninth Sermons, are partly taken from two eminent *French* Divines. They have, however, been preached before very diftinguifhed Congregations, and it was particularly recommended to me to give them a Place in this printed Collection.

I may fay of the Sermon upon the Divinity of *Chrift* (what a late Writer fays of his own religious Treatife) that it is "an Abftract only "— defigned to raife a proper At-" tention, and to create a Defire, in " young

"young or doubting Perfons, to "purfue the Subject — till the Mind "finds Reafon to be fatisfied in *that* "Certainty of Evidence the *whole* "produces," on which this effential Article of the chriftian Faith is founded.

The Reft of the Discourses (except in Matters strictly doctrinal) are taken from Life rather than from *Books*—from *Observation* rather than from *Reading*. I have *endeavoured* to represent the World as it *now* is —to make all possible *Allowance* for Error and Indiscretion — to give every possible *Commendation* to Principles and Conduct, lovely and of good Report. In a Word; whatever

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ever Imperfections may be difcovered in the following flender Performance, when examined with a critical Attention — I hope it will appear that I (at leaft) wi/b Religion well that I wi/b my Fellow-Mortals well — wi/b them to be happy Here but at all Events to take Care that they become fo Hereafter, through their own be/f Endeavours, perfected by the Merits and Mediation of Jefus Chrift.
