In whiche worke I compare, Flaunders, Fraunce, Portugall, Irelande, and Scotlande, to bee the shell of a precious Nutte, the sweete Kirnell whereof is the blessed state of ENGLANDE. And though with worldly wickednesser, and troubles of our tyme, the goodly shell is somewhat wormeath and cracked, the Kirnell shewes it self so sounde, that Gods greate geednesse & glorie is partly or altogether therein expressed.
