### 1.—THE SHAPE OF THE WORLD.—I.

1. **The World a Ball**.—The world we live on is round. But it is not round like a plate. It is like a ball in shape, or, rather, like an orange. It is one of a number of worlds that keep going round and round the sun; and it is from the sun that these worlds get both
