

PRELIMINARY.

LATELY, the people of Great Britain have been so violently excited by death in the workroom, amongst satin and flowers, death in the mother's arms, and death in the dank cellar; by death in Regent Street, death in Clerkenwell, and death in Bethnal Green, all premature and unnecessary, that they can scarcely require many more violent impulses to lead them to take any steps that may be necessary to prevent the repetition of such horrors,—to stop the involuntary suicide and unintentional murder now daily and hourly committed in the very centres of civilization.
