## PREFACE.

Primary Songs No. 2 is a collection of sacred and secular songs for the use of children in the Sabbath-school, in the home, the kindergarten, or the day-school.

It is intended for the little children, and much care has been taken to include only such pieces as can be easily understood and quickly learned. Some of them were written expressly for "the babies."

The aim has been to teach the children to love Christ with all their hearts and their neighbor as themselves. Plain, practical, every-day lessons are taught in simple rhyme.

Many songs for special occasions are included, as Christmas, Easter, Children's Day, Opening and Closing Hymns, Missionary, Graduating Songs, Birthday, Collection or Penny Songs, etc.

The secular songs are the choicest that could be gleaned from many sources, and many of them will be appreciated as old familiar pieces which have retained their hold upon the children of several generations.

There are many marches and motion songs, which will be found useful to the teacher who wishes to relieve the weariness of the little ones, who find it so hard to sit still.

### MARCH from FAUST.


