THE following Tables are offered to the notice of the Civil Servants of the Crown with the view of enabling each to ascertain for himself at a glance the amount of Superannuation Allowance he is, or will be, qualified to receive according to his length of Service and amount of Salary.

The Tables have been so arranged as to require little or no explanation beyond the simple inspection of them. Each opening of the book exhibits complete the amount of Superannuation Allowance assignable, after a certain number of years' Service to certain Salaries. The number of years' Service, and the amount of Salaries are shown in large figures at the top of each page.

Great care has been taken in the preparation of these Tables, and it is believed that they are as free from inaccuracies as possible.

CIVIL SERVICE AND CONSULAR PENSIONS.

Extract of an Act to alter, amend, and Consolidate the Laws for regulating the Pensions Compensations, and Allowances to be made to Persons in respect of their having held Civil Offices in His Majesty's Service.

4 & 5 Will. IV., c. 24.—25 July, 1834.

IX. And be it further enacted, That from and after the superpassing of this Act the superannuation allowances to be annuation granted to such Officers and Clerks who shall have to Persons entered the Public service prior to the 5th day of who entered the Public service prior to the 5th day of who entered the August, 1829 (except only as hereinafter is authorized), Service shall not exceed the following proportions with reference to the amount of their salaries and the periods of their 1829.

services respectively; videlicet:—

To an Officer, Clerk, or person who shall have served 10 years and upwards and under 15 years, any annual allowance not exceeding in amount 4-12ths of the annual salary and emoluments of his Office. For 15 years and upwards, and under 20 years, not exceeding 5-12ths of such Salary and Emoluments. For 20 years and upwards, and under 25 years, not exceeding 6-12ths of such Salary and Emoluments. For 25 years and upwards, and under 30 years, not exceeding 7-12ths of such Salary and Emoluments. For 30 years and upwards, and under 35 years, not exceeding 8-12ths of such Salary and Emoluments. For 35 years and upwards, and under 40 years, not exceeding 9-12ths of such Salary and Emoluments. For 40 years and upwards, and under 45 years, not exceeding 10-12ths of such Salary and Emoluments.

For 45 years and upwards, and under 50 years, not exceeding 11-12ths of such Salary and Emoluments. And for 50 years or upwards, any annual allowance not exceeding the net amount of the Salary and Emoluments of his Office.

XII. Provided always, and be it further enacted,

Superannuations not to be advanced Salary received for less than Three years.

That the superannuation allowance to be granted to any granted on Officer or Person after the passing of this Act, shall not Amount of be computed upon the amount of the Salary enjoyed by him at the time of his retirement, unless he shall have been in the receipt of the same, or in the class from which he retires, for a period of at least three years immediately before the granting of such Superannuation Allowance; and in case he shall not have enjoyed his then existing salary or have been in such class for that period, such Superannuation Allowance shall be calculated upon the average amount of Salary received by such Person for three years next preceding the commencement of such allowance.

Act not to give an absolute Right to Allowances, or to pre-vent Dismiseal of Persons for Misconduct.

XXX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to give any person an absolute right to Compensation for past services, or to any Superannuation or Retiring Allowance under this Act, or to deprive the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the heads or Principal Officers of the respective Departments, of their power and authority to dismiss any person from the Public service without compensation.
