- " 200, Benj. Williamson married Eliza Elliott.
- " 206, line 20: Edward M., not C., midshipman on Alabama.
- " 63, IV. Called by some, Matilda; by others, Sarah Fenwick. There may have been two of them, tho' the Jones say it was Sarah.
- Page 174, Dr. Thomas F. Screven, not P., had also Richard Screven who died.
- " 165, line 25: John Dennis of Brunswide, N. J., not Brunswick. He had I. Col. Richard Dennis and three daughters, Sarah C., Elizabeth and Margaret Dennis. James Gignilliat and Charlotte Pepper had also Elizabeth who married Col. John Cooper. See pages 99 and 103.
- Page 120, line 2: Lieutenant Pierre, and not St. Pierre Mercier.
- " 97. Note: Ramsay, not Ramsey.
- Katharine Elliott Habersham should by sign be g, not c, and be Katharine as on page 8. See pages 5 and 8. Not sure as to marriage of Margaret Lesesne to one mentioned; might be Mathewes; not sure that the son of Edward M. Habersham was Edward J., page 7.
- Page 165, Judge Walter S. Chisholm who married Eliza Clifford Anderson, not Georgia Anderson.
- Page 167, line 3 from bottom: and her nephew.
- " 146, Eliza Screven Hart was daughter of John Hart and Mary Screven, daughter of Gen. James Screven and Mary Odingsell, son of James Screven and Mary Hyrne Smith, etc. See page 171.

The following table shows the results of the experiment. The first column is the number of trials, the second column is the number of correct responses, and the third column is the percentage of correct responses. The data shows that the percentage of correct responses increases as the number of trials increases, indicating that the subject is learning the task.

The results of the experiment show that the subject's performance is stable around 50-60% correct responses. The percentage of correct responses does not increase significantly with more trials, suggesting that the subject has reached a plateau in learning the task.

Page 5 Line 15 from bottom should read daughter of John Raven Matthewes not daughter of Edward Matthewes.

Page 7 Line 6 from top of page read Richard West Habersham married Martha daughter of John Raven Matthews not Edward.

Page 7 Line 4 from bottom read Margaret Lesesue did not marry Thompson but Wm. Maner Bostick.

Page 8 Line 6 read Ella.

Page 8 Line 8 read Edward Hedden Habersham.

Page 23 read Col Wm. S. Rockwell had also a son Theodosius and two daughters Hermione and Bertha.

Page 40 Line 10 read Edmund not Edward Pendleton Rogers.

Page 49 Line 8 read Alfred Cuthbert and Sarah Jones had only one son Alfred Cuthbert who married Anna M. Davis and had as below given.

Page 63 note bottom of page read Commodore Josiah not E. F. Tattall.

Page 74 Line 5 read Nov. 9, 1673 not 1763 and same page line 10 Ann not Elizabeth Bowers.

Page 85 read Nicholas J. son of Dr. Nicholas S. Bayard and Ann Livingston and on same page note should be Nicholas J. Bayard m. 1st Sarah daughter of Noble Glen and had I John Bayard m. Rose Howell II. Florida Bayard m. John J. Seay his 2nd wife and had: 1. Clifford Seay m. Miss Streett, 2. Florida Seay m. James J. Tracy.

Page 87 Line 23 read Edward Quintard m. Miss Shepherd daughter of Governor Shepherd of Washington, D. C.

It is now known that the ancestor of the Barringtons was Josiah. See Barrington.

Page 120 See Washington and Stanyarne, and for a more correct version consult the Strother family by Owen, and the Bulloch, Stobo book by Bulloch of these families. After line 4 page 121 the data is correct.

Page 123 and 124-See extra Sheet on Joyner by Dr. J. T. Curry where it is shown that the first Dr. Brantly m. twice. 1st to a McDonald, Sister of Gov. McDonald of Ga. issue. 2nd to Margaret Joyner issue. See also page 124 and compare with record sheet inserted.

Rev. John Brantly and Hemans and others were by McDonald marriage.

Page 125 Consult Bulloch Stobo and Irvine of Cults for a more correct history as regards the marriage and issue of James Stanyarne.

Page 132 See Ellis family by A. S. Salley in which there is a more correct history as to the first generation of marriages of Richard and Edmund and Ellis.

Page 138 and 139 require correction as to Pinckney history and marriages of Col Brewton who did not marry a Pinckney, nor do the Jones's descend from Pinckney. See Salley's History of Pinckney for correct data.

Page 139 at bottom read Robert Brewton and Mellicent Bulloch not Bulloch had: Mary who married Joseph Jones, and had, Major John and Millicent Jones.

Page 158 It doesnot appear that this Moore family was the same as that of Gov. Moore of S. C.

Page 164 Line 11 read John Postell not Posey Williamson.

Page 169 and 190 read Samuel Screven was the father of those given to Wm. Screven and Catherine Stoll.

Page 198 Line 8 read Wm. Patrick Johnston m. Mary Hooe not Hool.

Page 203 A more correct history of Fuller and Potter and Cuthbert will be found in the book Cuthberts of Castle Hill and their descendants in S. C. and Georgia by Bulloch.

Page 209 Line 14 read Thomas not Wm. Clifford.

Page 220 There was no Pinckney descent of Jones family but the Brewtons were related to Pinckney through a marriage of a Pinckney to Ruth Brewton.

Page 63 For a Correct account of Fenwick family see D. E. Huger Smith's article in January Number of S. C. Genealogical Magazine and an error corrected by me and acknowledged by Mr. Smith in the April number as regards the Jones descent.
