

## EDITOR'S PREFACE.



HE Life of Flora Macdonald, and her adventures with Prince Charles, appeared at different times in the *Celtic Magasine*, and it is now given to the

public in this form to fill up a gap in the History of the Highlands; for hitherto no complete authentic account of Flora Macdonald's Life has appeared.

Her Life by her grand-daughter, Mrs. Wylde, is admittedly a romance in which fiction predominates; and the general reader is quite unable to separate the fiction from the facts.

The Rev. Author of this narrative had opportunities of obtaining information which enabled him to make the work peculiarly valuable and interesting; and our only regret in connection with it is, that he did not survive to see it through the press.

It was originally intended to add notes by the Editor of the *Celtic Magasine*, but, except in a very few instances, this idea has been departed from, in consequence of Mr. Macgregor's death. The whole has however been revised as much as it was possible to do without substantial interference with its original style and phraseology; and the work, it is hoped, will be found worthy of the reputation of the Author, notwithstanding that it was first written in a fragmentary form, and at various times, and that Mr. Macgregor himself had not an opportunity of revising and preparing it for publication in this form.
