PREFACE

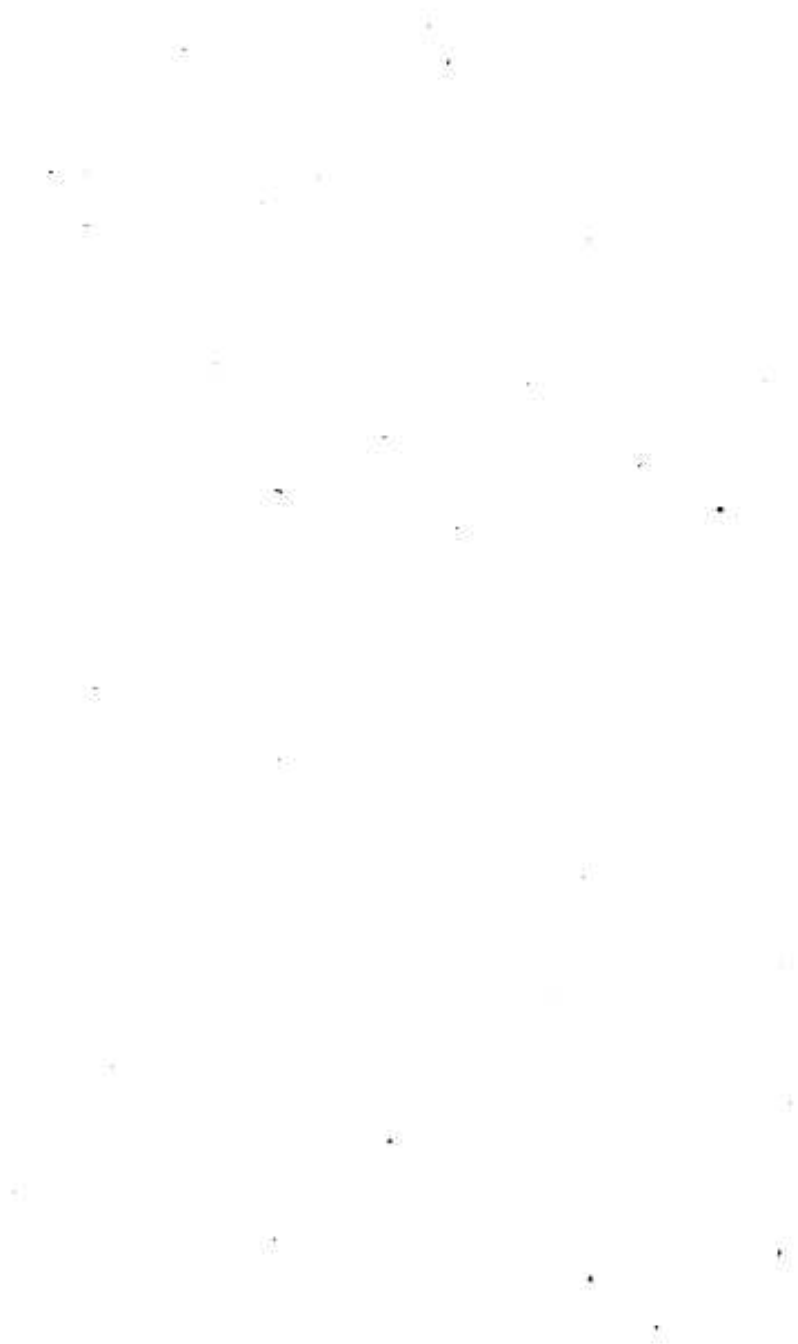
