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## Preface.

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THE following CATALOGUE of Writings by the GRIMALDI, is the result of various researches and collections made at intervals during the past ten years.

In 1873, I forwarded a printed Circular Letter in French, to all the great Libraries on the Continent, and received in return very speedy and courteous replies, containing much helpful information, for which I may here take occasion to make my best acknowledgments.

The following are the Places or Institutions from the Libraries in which I received returns:—Amsterdam, Angers, Augsburg, Avignon, Basel, Berlin, Bern, Bologna, Bonn, Bremen, Carlsruhe, Cassel, Copenhagen, Douai, Dresden, Eisenach, Evora, Ferrara, Firenze, Frankfurt, Gand, Genève, Geneviève, Hague, Hanover, Invalides, Königsberg, Leipzig, Modena, Modena University, München, Napoli, Paris, Perugia, Rennes, Salzboung, Siracusa, Stockholm, Torino, Torino Royal, Torino University, Ulm, Valetta, Venezia, Verceil, Vienna, Zurich.

I also personally searched various other Libraries while visiting England, Scotland, Ireland, France, Belgium, Italy, and Spain, the names of which will mostly be found mentioned in the *List of Libraries*; and I obtained some further notices of Books from William Beaufort Grimaldi, derived by him from Libraries which he examined, during his frequent visits to France and Italy.

To obtain as many Titles as possible, I also searched all the Works upon Bibliography which I could hear of, English and Foreign, and

numerous printed Catalogues of Libraries, and Booksellers' Sale Catalogues; as well as very many Works in Biography and General Literature.

It may therefore be reasonably concluded that not many Writings have escaped notice; though no doubt some small Tracts and Leaflets, not now extant, and perhaps others from not being entered in Continental Catalogues (which are often sadly deficient), have remained undetected.

In compiling such a Catalogue, one cannot but be again impressed with the great want sustained by Literature, and Literary Students of all Classes, by the absence of a General Catalogue of Printed Literature. Probably all Students have at some time or other desired to refer to such a Universal Compendium. And it would seem possible of execution at a less cost of time, labour, and money, than at first sight might appear necessary; if economy and division of labour were strictly enforced.

The plan pursued in the following Catalogue, of a Chronological Arrangement, would perhaps on the whole be the most useful, practical, and complete. Each year being printed as a separate volume could be easily added to, as fresh titles were discovered; while the whole would present a vast panorama of Universal Literature. And could enough Contributors be enrolled to give only one year to each, the labour would be comparatively moderate.

Those Writings whose dates of publication I have not found are placed at the end of their respective Centuries, if that also is unknown at the end of the Catalogue. Some entries obtained too late for correct insertion are entered in the same way.

The whole Title page has been copied, with its commencing Capitals, and its Italics; and where this could not be obtained, as full a Title as possible is given. Then succeed a few details concerning the Writing, which are preceded by a square bracket when the Title has been transcribed from a copy of the Writing itself.

The size and number of pages are given first. In unpagged Works the pages have been counted and placed before the letters *pp.* Where the Entry refers to an Article in some other Work, the Author and Title of that Work are also given.

Such Libraries as contain Copies are next mentioned, the British Museum being named first, the rest in alphabetical order, while the initials A.B.G. are placed to those Writings of which I possess copies. The full explanation of the names used to denote the Libraries will be found in the *List of Libraries referred to.*



Following these are enumerated such Books as make mention of the Writing Catalogued, arranged in alphabetical order by their Author's names; the full Titles of their Works being given in the *List of Works referred to*.

The number of plates or woodcuts, if any, is also mentioned; and occasionally a brief note elucidating the title, or explaining the source it is derived from has been added to the other details.

For the sake of clearness, and accuracy, every distinct edition of a Work has been separately entered under the proper date. Every reprint whether with or without additions or alterations has also in a similar manner received a separate entry.

In the case of any Series of Letters or Articles contributed to Periodicals; each Letter or Article, as having been printed in a different time, has been treated as a separate publication and entered accordingly.

In one or two cases, from only having received a very imperfect note of the title, a Work which only *refers* to some one of the name, may have been erroneously entered as being *by* them.
