### CHAPTER I.



BENJAMIN HARRISON.

Benjamin Harrison was born at North Bend, Ohio, August 20, 1833, and is the son of John Scott Harrison, who was the son of the ninth President. He studied at the Miami University at Oxford, and was a law student at Cincinnati. He settled in Indianapolis, Ind., when he began to practice law, and it has been his home ever since, but at the opening of the Civil War he raised the Seventeenth Indiana Regiment and was appointed its colonel. He was a brave and skillful officer and was brevetted brigadier-general. He was elected United States Senator in 1880, and was elected President of the United States in 1888. After retiring from the Presidency he resumed the practice of law in Indianapolis, devoting himself mainly to international affairs. On the opening of Stanford University he delivered a series of lectures to the students on Constitutional Law.

In the Presidential election of 1888, Benjamin Harrison of Indiana was elected President, and Levi P. Morton of New York, Vice-President, defeating the Democratic candidates, Grover Cleveland for President and Allen G. Thurman for Vice-President. President Harrison was inaugurated March 4, 1889, and selected as his Secretary of State the eminent statesman, James G. Blaine. Before Harrison took office a number of important measures be-
