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

Our text is not a sentence of Scripture, as texts usually are, but a single expression. It is, however, an exceedingly striking expression. That is, perhaps, not apparent from the translation of it which is given in the Authorized Version. The " Preaching of the Cross," as the familiar rendering is, does not do justice to the original phrase. The "Preaching of the Cross" suggests what may be described as evangelical preaching-that type of preaching which makes the Cross its chief, and indeed its only, subject. A distinction seems to be implied between various kinds of discoursesethical, philosophical, biographical, and so onbut these are all left out of account; and the discourses, which are declared to be invested with the power of God unto salvation, are those which concentrate on "Jesus Christ and Him Crucified."
