PREFACE

There is an entrance examination to every course of study leading to a primary degree, like B.A., B.S.

This examination varies somewhat in the different institutions, but it may be said that the average entrance examination is upon those branches which are studied in the average high school.

Usually a man must be a bachelor before he can commence the course leading to a master degree, and a master before he can become a candidate for a doctor degree.

There is always an examination before a degree is conferred, although this may not be distinctly stated in this work.
