At present there are over eight hundred members in the Society, and these persons, whether engaged in research, teaching, industry, business, or the investigation of specific problems of social amelioration, find opportunities for the exchange of thought in the annual meetings and through the publications of the Society.

The Society owns its inception to the conviction of its founders and present members that persons interested in the sane, permanent progress of society should have opportunity to meet regularly for the discussion of subjects of common interest. The meetings thus far have proved of great value by furthering the unification of sociological theory, by increasing knowledge of particular problems, and by bringing members of the Society into personal relations with one another.
