STATISTICAL REPORT.

The average annual strength of the troops serving at home and abroad in White 1877, as computed from the returns received by the Army Medical Department, Troops at was 174,884 non-commissioned officers and men (exclusive of the Royal Malta Home and Abroad. At Home and 2nd West India Regiments, and the Gun Lascars at Ceylon, and at Hong Kong, Corps which are not recruited at home); the admissions into hospital in this force were 165,371, and the deaths 1,723. The rates represented by these numbers are for admissions into hospital 946, and for deaths 9.55 per 1,000 of the average annual strength, the latter being calculated on a strength of 180,351, which includes detached men.

The statistics of some of the most important of the results of sickness, in every Command in which the troops were stationed, are exhibited in the following Table:—
