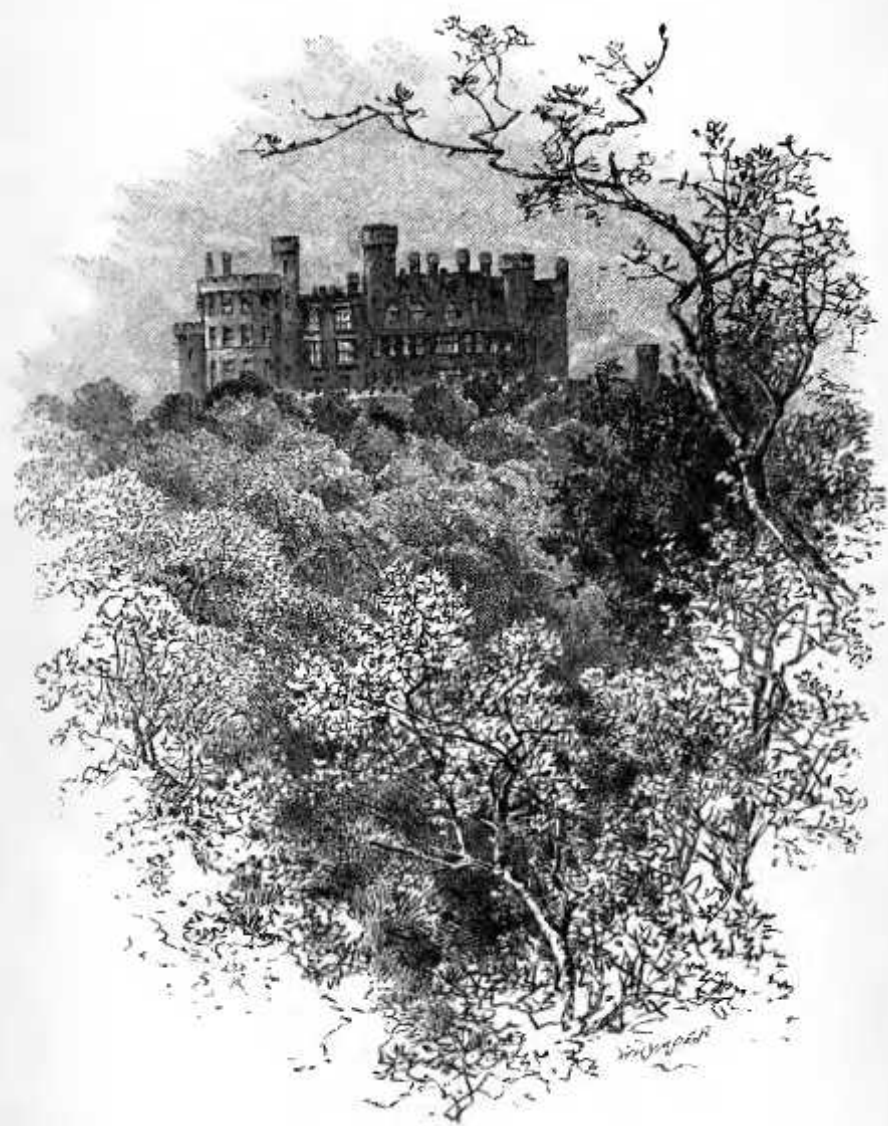

Preface.

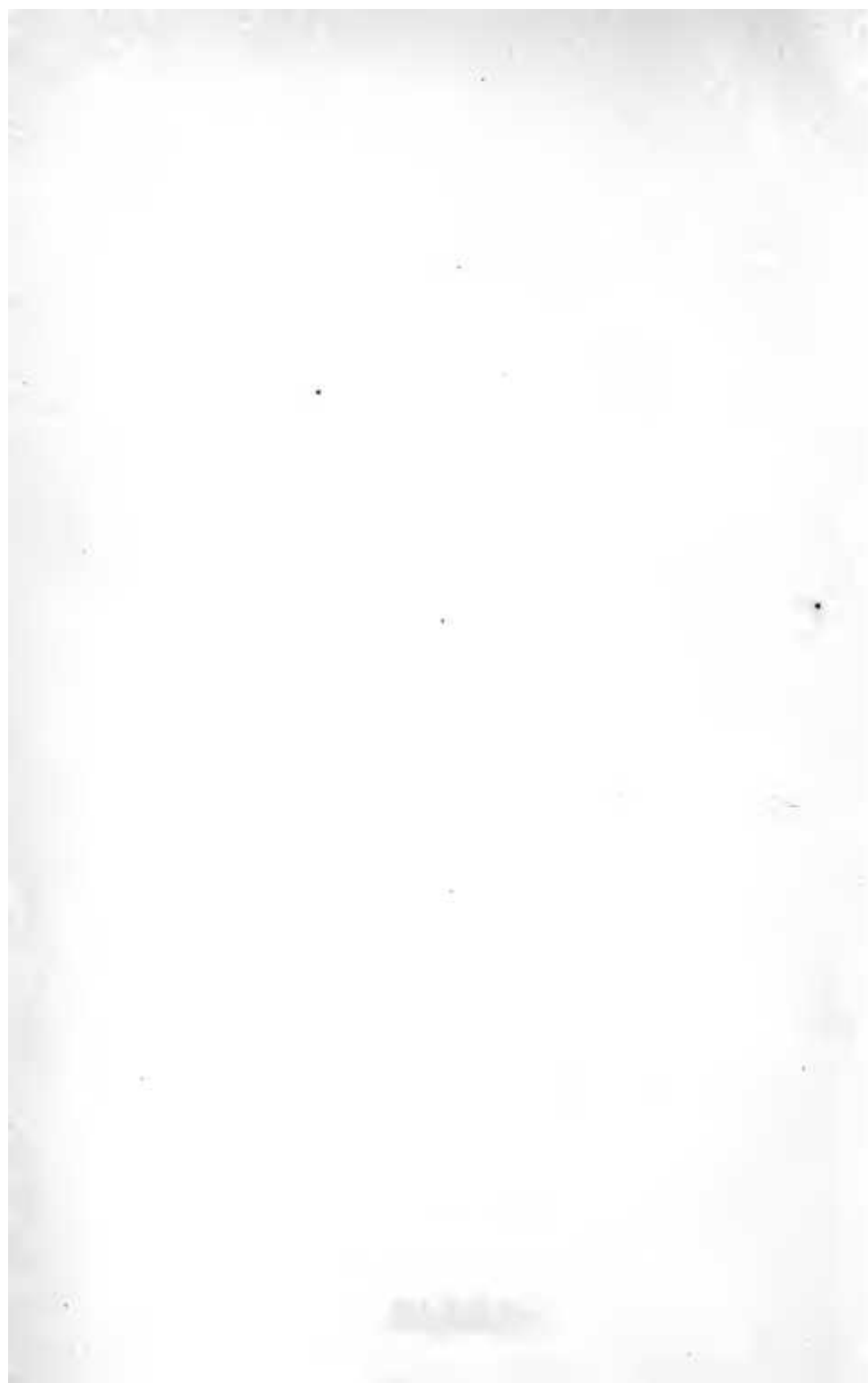
