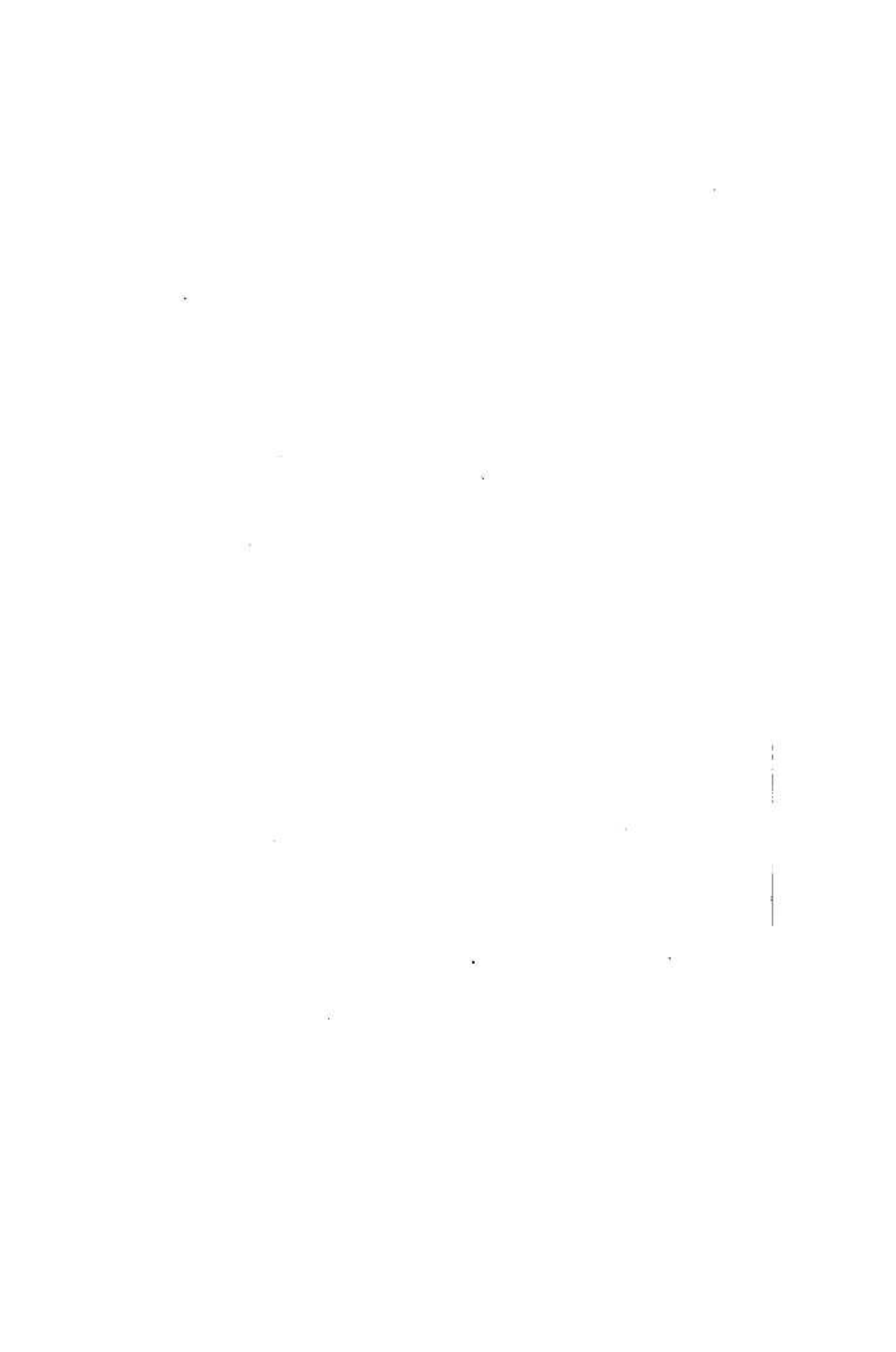


Preface
