PREFACE

THESE sketches were prepared at intervals in my leisure for Belford's Magazine. I had an idea that in the form in which they are cast, I could say some things which could not be said in any other way. Lest some might mistake my meaning, I will explain the object I had in view at the time I sent the first paper of the series to the printers. The old Professor, the reader will observe, is not always a mere talker, but must be considered in the light of a lecturer. The younger men are his foils. Occasionly they take part in the conversations, but only in a way that serves to assist the older man in giving utterance to his thoughts about the authors and works which come under review.
