THE NATIONAL VIGILANCE ASSOCIATION is an association of men and women to enforce and improve the laws for the repression of criminal vice and public immorality, to check the causes of vice, and to protect minors. The work is pursued with vigour; but if this is to continue, the treasury must be kept full, and those who are deeply convinced of the necessity of raising the standard of moral conduct, by legal proceedings, by the strengthening of public opinion, and by the awakening of voluntary effort, can hardly make a better use of their money than by contributing to maintain and enlarge the operations of the Association.

While we feel it important in the history of the work to be ready always to render legal aid, we are more than ever conscious that the great hope of the future of our cause is in the direction of Prevention.

The Association has a Home which is established for Preventive cases only, and young women in perilous circumstances are received and sheltered. They are taught laundry and house-work, and when competent, suitable employment is found for them.

The Association is supported by voluntary contributions. Cheques and Postal Orders should be crossed National Provincial Bank of England, and can be sent to either the Treasurer or the Secretary at the Office.

The Report of last year's work will be sent on application to the Secretary.

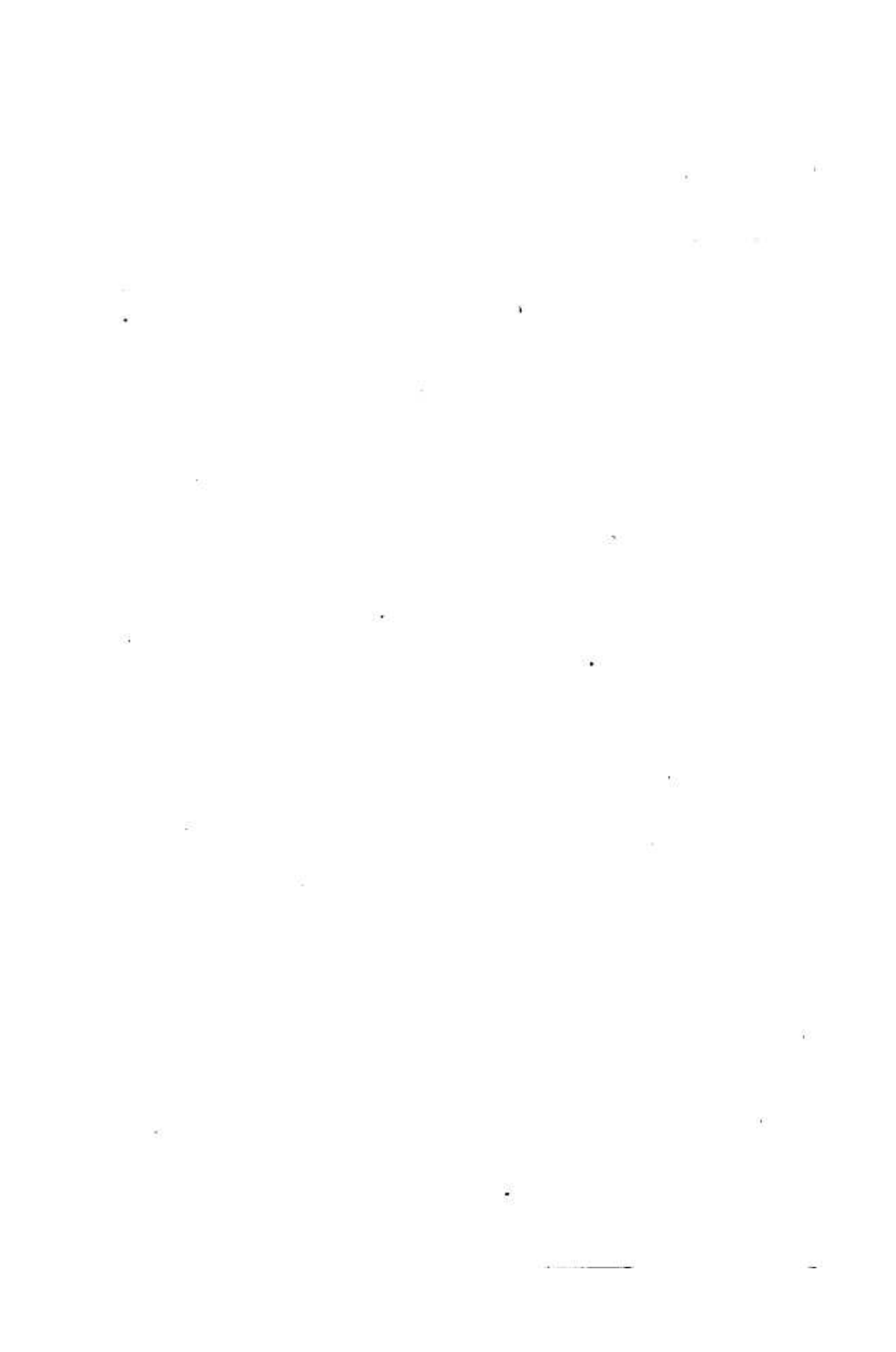
