### PREFACE.

Many of the verses contained in this little volume have already appeared in magazines or reviews, the majority of them in The New Age. The Authoress is indebted to the Editor of that paper for permission to print them in the present form.

In publishing the plays, she has been partly influenced by the assurances of one or two High School mistresses that such plays would prove useful for representation at school entertainments. "Mercy" and "Two Nations" were originally written—in the autumn of 1898 and 1899 respectively—for acting at private Christmas parties. The fact that almost all of those who took part in them were under seventeen years of age seems to shew that their performance in schools is not impracticable. Needless to say, their plots are entirely fictitious, but where real historical characters have been introduced the Authoress has to the best of her ability presented them faithfully.
