## P R E F A C E.

If these pages have any interest for Irishmen, they can possess none for outsiders. It may not be unprofitable for our own people, in the Centennial of 1798, to acquaint themselves with the difficulties which beset the course of a Constitutional Movement, and study the causes which affect the power of a Parliamentary Party.

When Nationalists understand how the business of the country is sped, in their own day, and under their own eyes, they will come to judge the past more accurately, and the prospects of the future more acutely.

Those who may question the conclusions of this narrative, can confine themselves solely to the extracts—taken from sources which are indisputable—and base a judgment upon them alone.

DUBLIN, 22nd October, 1898.
