A vast mass of our early literature is still unprinted, and notwithstanding the efforts of the Percy, Camden, and other Societies and Printing Clubs, more than half our early printed literature (including the romances relating to the national hero, Arthur), is still inaccessible to the student of moderate means. The publications of the Society will consist of works, some of which will be printed for the first time from the manuscript, and others re-edited from the MSS, from which they were originally printed, or from earlier MSS, when such are known to exist. Nor will reprints of scarce printed books, of which the MSS, are not in existence, be considered as beyond the Society's province.
