in whose interest most of the explorations and researches of the past twenty years have been made—now terminated by his early death—

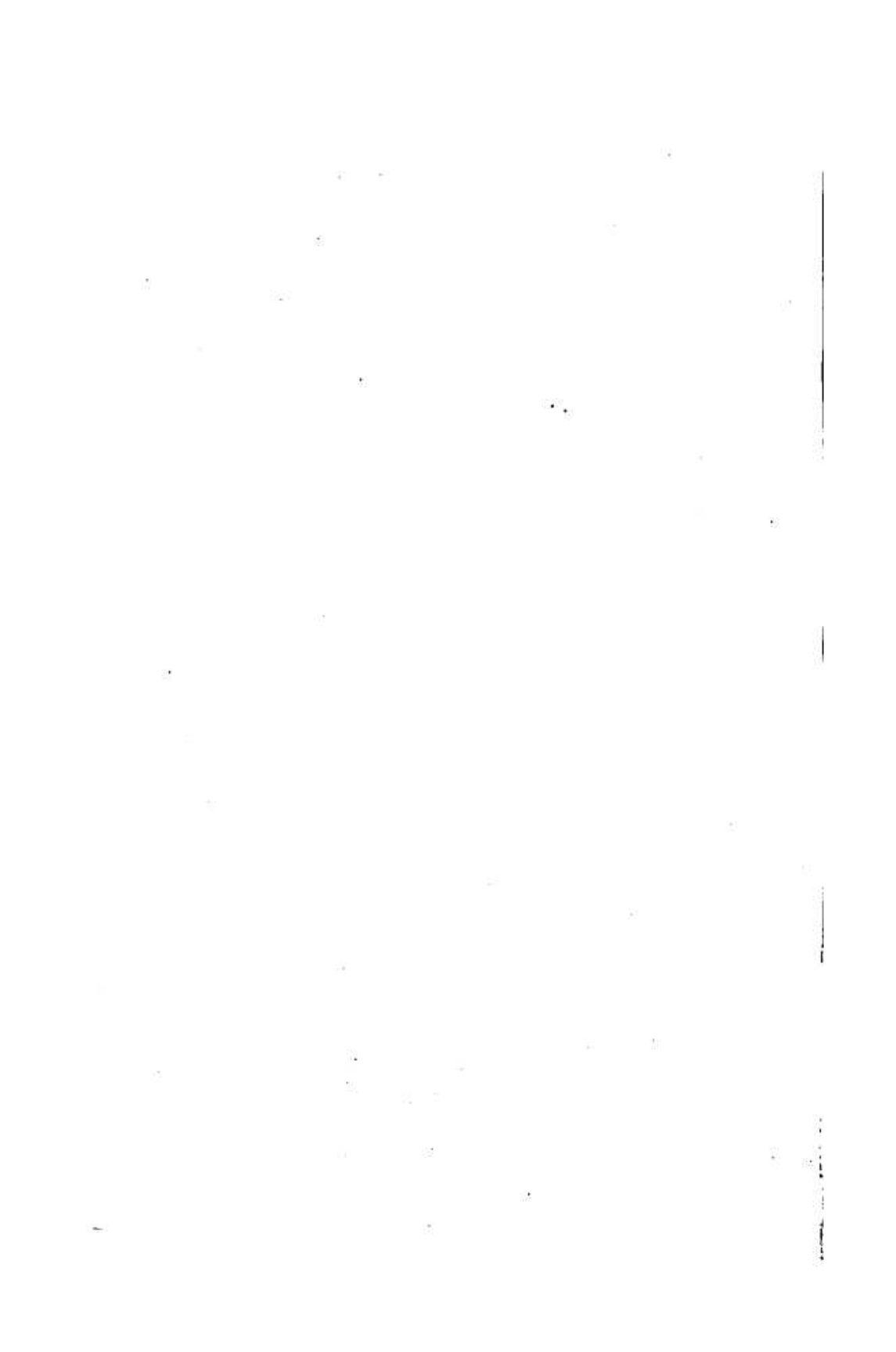
