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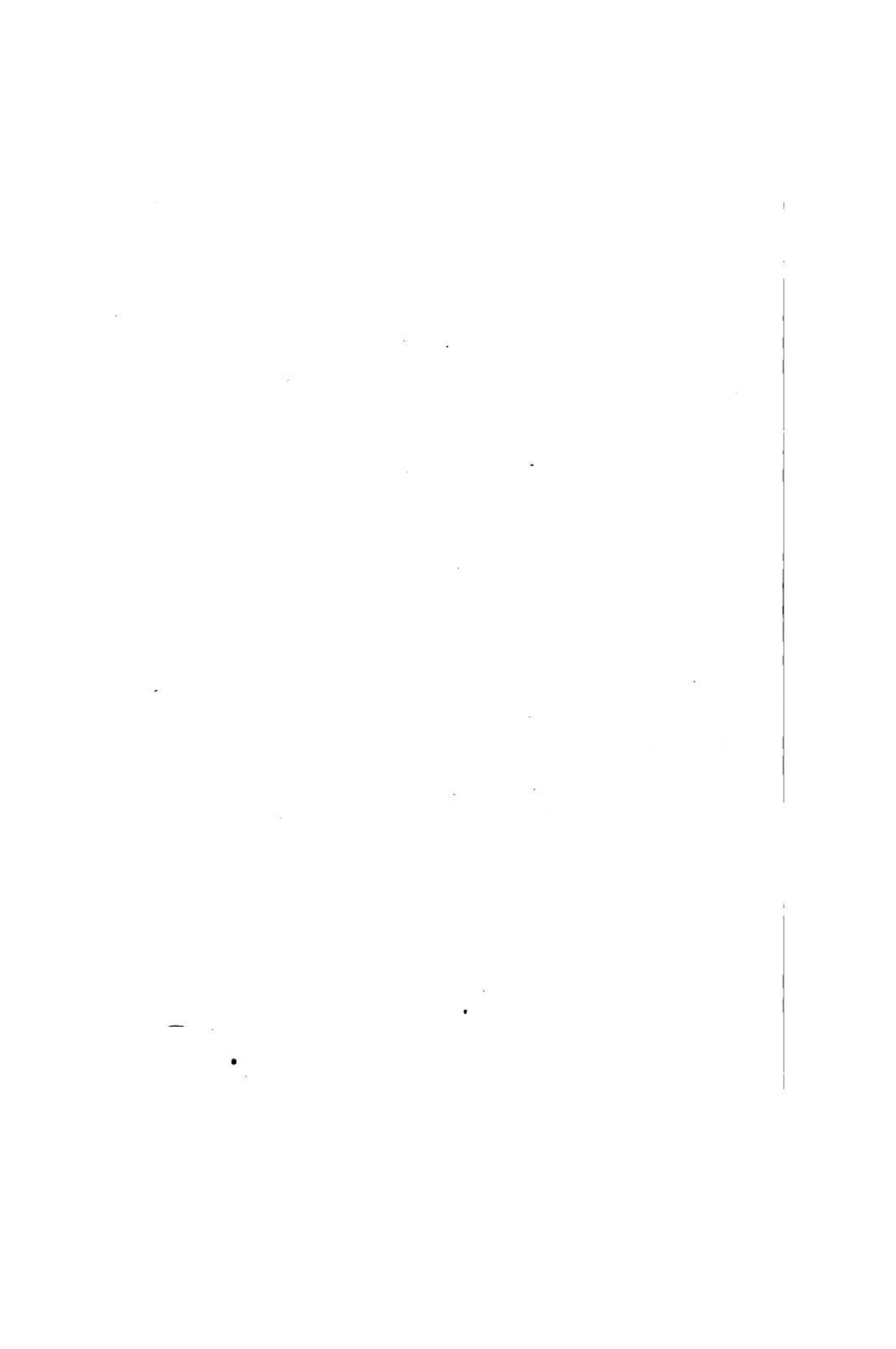

This Family now use the same Arms as those borne by the Salopian Branch, but upon a rough Pedigree (without date) submitted to the Author were painted the Arms as above, but with a mullet in chief, and three mascles instead of lozenges, whilst the squirrel was proper without collar and bezants, the motto being:—"Post Hyemem Ver."

As the third son differences his paternal coat with a mullet (J. Cussans's 'Handbook of Heraldry,' p. 139), it would appear that George Haslewood of Walsall was a descendant of George, the third son of Thomas Haslewood of Oldington, and Jane (*née* Yeate), whose Pedigree is printed in full. Haslewood

STAFFORDSHIRE AND

George Haslewood of Walsall, Staffordshire, "Maltster and Chandler." Enrolled a Burgess of Bridgnorth, Shropshire, 23 April 1705. Mentioned in the will of his son William. Bur. 4 Aug. 1748, at St. Matthew's Church, Walsall. Will dated 23 July 1748, proved 10 April 1749, at Lichfield.

<p>William Haslewood of Walsall, Maltster. "William Haslewood." Mayor in 1743; 'Hist. of Walsall' by E. L. Giew, pub. 1856, p. 123. Died in the lifetime of his father. Will dat. 7 Nov. 1746, proved 14 August 1747, at Lichfield; mentions "my brother-in-law Thomas Dicken Freeman."</p>	<p>Mary Freeman, married 9 July 1718, at St. Matthew's, Walsall. In her husband's will called "my loving wife Mary." Bur. 19 Feb. 1759, at Walsall. Will dated 30 Mar. 1759, proved 20 Oct. 1763, at Lichfield; describes herself "of Walsall, co. Stafford, widow." Besides Thos., Geo., Joseph, and Mary, she mentions Thos. Spurrier.</p>
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George Haslewood of Walsall, Maltster. Called "eldest son" in the wills of his father, 1746, and mother, 1759. In his sister Mary's will, 1772, he is described as "deputy postmaster of the town of Walsall." She also mentions "three nieces, daughters of my brother George." Will dat. 23 June 1778, proved 13 Feb. 1779, at Lichfield.

Mary, baptized 23 May 1720, at Walsall. Mentioned in wills of her father, 1746; grandfather, 1748; & mother, 1759, executrix to the latter. Buried 5 Feb. 1773, at St. Matthew's, Walsall. Will dat. 29 Dec. 1772, prov. 23 Feb. 1773, at Lichfield, describes herself "of Walsall, spinster."

William, bapt. 27 Dec. 1721; bur. 11 July 1726, at Walsall.

Ann, bapt. 7 Feb. 1723, at Walsall; mar. there 26 July 1750, Thomas Willington. She is mentioned in wills of her father, 1746; grandfather, 1748; under her mother's will, 1759, was legatee to £250. Joseph Willington is named in will of his aunt Mary.

Anna Maria. Thus named in her father's will, 1778: "my eldest daughter if she does not before 21 marry without the consent of her uncle Thomas Haslewood." Nieces mentioned in will of Mary, 1772.

Charles and Thomas, twins, born 13 Sept., both bapt. 15 Oct. 1756, at St. Philip's Church, Birmingham. Thomas died 15 Jan. 1757; Charles d. 16, bur. 17 Jan. 1757.

Catherine, b. 20 Jan., bapt. 29 Mar. 1758, at St. Philip's Ch., Birmingham; died 28, bur. 31 Aug. 1760, at St. Matthew's, Walsall.

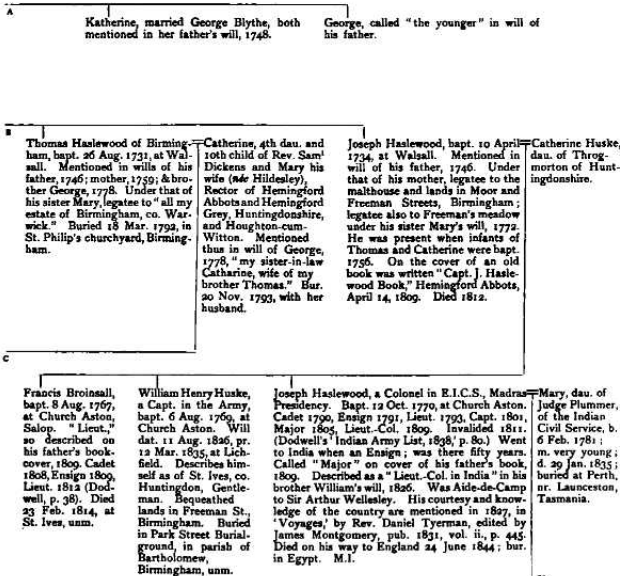
Dickens Haslewood, Vicar of Aycliffe, co. Durham, b. 28 Mar., bapt. 19 Aug. 1760, at St. Philip's Ch., Birmingham (wrongly described in register as son of Thomas and Ann). Ch. Ch., Ox., B.A. 1781, M.A. 1784. Inherited property in Freeman Street, Birmingham. At one time Curate of Aston; Vic. of Aycliffe, 1805 ('Gent. Mag.', 75, i. 1233); appointed Sacrist and Librarian of Durham Cathedral, 1810 ('Gent. Mag.', 80, ii. 659). "Died 3 Oct. 1821, at Durham, at 61, Rector of St. Mary the Less, Durham, Vicar of Aycliffe, Minor Canon and Sacrist of the Cath. & Librarian." ('Gent. Mag.', 91, ii. 281.) Bur. in the Cath. yard. M.I. Also M.I. to twin brothers, his sons, buried there. Will dated 28 Jan. 1817, prov. 18 Jan. 1822, at Durham.

Elizabeth, dan. of John and Sarah Bouilly, a Master Mariner, bapt. 10 Dec. 1759, at North Shields; m. there 15 Feb. 1789, her husband then Rector of Little St. Mary's, Durham. ('Europ. Mag.', xi. 213.) Under her husband's will legatee to messuages in Freeman, Park, and Moor Streets, Birmingham. After his death removed to Bishopwearmouth; d. 1 July 1825, at 65. Bur. in Cathedral yard, Durham. M.I.

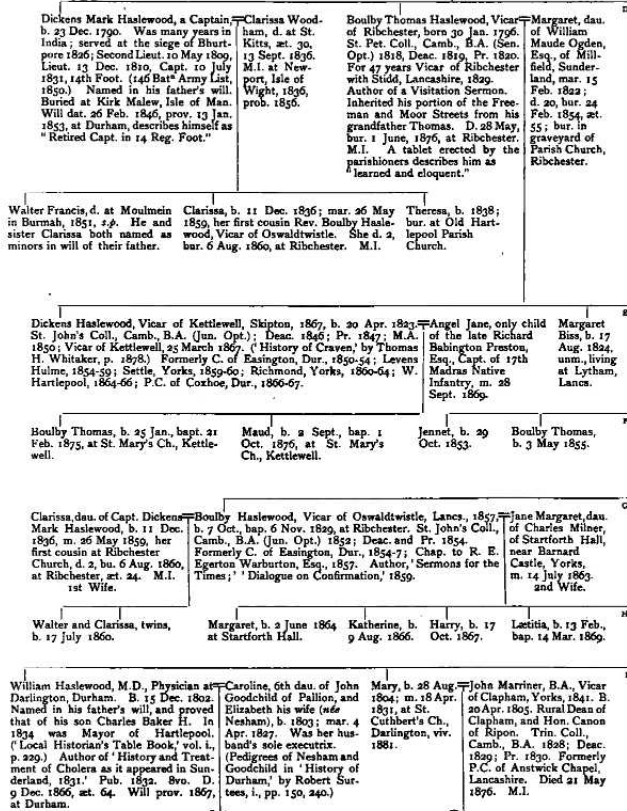
