This Family now use the same Arms as those borne by the Salopian Branch, but upon a rough Pedigree (without date) submitted to the Author were painted the Arms as above, but with a mullet in chief, and three mascles instead of lozenges, whilst the squirrel was proper without collar and bezants, the motto being:—" Post Hyemem Ver."

As the third son differences his paternal coat with a mullet (J. Cussans's 'Handbook of Heraldry,' p. 139), it would appear that George Haslewood of Walsall was a descendant of George, the third son of Thomas Haslewood of Oldington, and Jane (née Yeate), whose Pedigree is printed in full.
