

#### PREFACE.

Is presenting to the world a second edition of his third publication, after each of the others has reached the same elevation, the Nottingham Mechanic feels it a doty incumbent upon him to return his sincere thanks to the public for the liberal patronage he has received; to the critics in general for their favourable notice of his productions; and more especially to those acknowledged masters of thought and language who have given him such kind assurances of encouragement and esteem. He started out in the literary world with a faint hope that he should not be altogether disregarded; but he is constrained to admit, that the reception he has met with has exceeded his most sanguine expectations,
