The Kingdom of Scotland.

C H A P. I.

The Wars and Hostility between the Kingdoms of England, and Scotland.

FROM very remote times the islands of Great-Britain had been divided into two distinct Parts or Regions.

In the Southern part seven different Sovereign-ties were established, which became successively united into one, and formed the Monarchy and Country of England.

The Northern part of the Island, being nearly three hundred miles in length, formed the Kingdom and Country of Scotland; which was totally independent on, and unconnected with the Monarchy established in the South.

Those Kings who had united the seven Saxon Sovereign-ties under their dominion, were not without some ambition also to make the conquest of Scotland, as we may judge from the inscrip-
