INTRODUCTION.

On the first day of September, 1862, the 11th Regiment Vermont Volunteers was mustered into the United States service at Brattleboro, Vt., with about one thousand men and officers. The regiment was commanded by Col. James M. Warner, late Brigadier Gen. U. S. Vols. It immediately went to Washington, D. C., and was stationed in the northern defences of Washington, where it remained for about twenty months, during which time it was recruited to 12 companies of 150 men and officers to each company, making a regiment of 1800 men. In the month of May, 1864, the regiment was sent to the front and was brigaded with the *Old Vermont Brigade*, 2d Brigade, 2d Division, 6th Army Corps. At the time the regiment was brigaded at Spottsylvania, Va., it mustered more men than the rest of the brigade of five regiments. The active service of the regiment was in connection and with the *Old Vermont Brigade*, of which I do not propose to enter into detail at present, but to give as complete a Roster of the regiment as is possible with the data at hand to compile from, trusting that the comrades will bear with me in all omission or mistakes made. It is the purpose of the society to issue this pamphlet that the survivors may read and make corrections and additions to the same. All comrades are requested to note the same and notify the secretary at once. In attempting to compile this Roster at the request of the society, I find it not so easy a task as one might suppose, and feel that if some one else had been selected to do the work, it would have given better satisfaction; but as I was disciplined to do my duty while a member of the "*glorious old 11th*," I will now try and make as brave an attempt to respond to orders as of yore. Comrades will notice that I have been able to locate about 1000 of the survivors of the regiment, and have the

reports of the deaths of nearly 700, leaving about 650 men yet to be accounted for, out of a total of 2,320 enlistments in the regiment during its service. It is hoped that comrades knowing anything about members that are not accounted for, will notify the secretary at once, and thus a complete Roster together with a history of the regiment may be written at some future time. I have tried to give the rank of all commissioned officers who held the same in this regiment, and in doing so there are many names duplicated. There were several who received and held commissions in other regiments for which credit is not here given. As regards non-commissioned officers, I could not very well give all credit, as it would fill a volume of its own; but the credit of being in the ranks in such a regiment and serving with the same in a brigade that has the *glorious record* that the *Old Vermont Brigade* earned while in the field, is honor and glory enough for us all. You served with a *brigade* that was never known to allow the enemy to lay hands on their colors, always carrying them into *battle* waving and bringing them off crowned with victory. No *Vermont regiment* ever deserted or left their colors on the field of battle; always at the front, ever in the thickest of the fight, and yet never lowered their colors to the enemy. So much for the *Ethan Allen Guards*.
