PREFACE

EACH book is entered in the following Catalogue with its full title under the name of the author. In cases of joint authorship, the books appear under the name of each author, but new editions of books, although they may be edited by another, appear only under the name of the original author. Anonymous works are entered in full under the distinguishing word of the title.

Each book is also entered under the heading of the subject to which it chiefly relates—the title of the book, in this entry, being sometimes abridged. The entries under the subject-headings are arranged in chronological order, except in some instances where another arrangement has obvious advantages. Books which deal in the general sense with subjects such as 'Law' or 'Book-keeping' are entered under the corresponding general headings, but books which treat of special branches of these subjects, such as 'Bank Book-keeping' or 'Mercantile Law,' appear only under the appropriate special headings.

Only such Blue Books and Parliamentary Papers as are likely to remain of permanent interest have been included in the Catalogue. One or two Books, which are marked with an asterisk, are the property of the Edinburgh Chartered Accountants Students' Society.

A list of all books added to the Library will in future appear regularly in 'The Accountants' Magazine.' The present catalogue is issued with blank pages interleaved, so that it may be kept up to date by writing in the entries from the Magazine. A Cabinet containing a Card Catalogue has also been placed in the Library for reference. As cards are inserted whenever a new book is procured, a convenient and complete Catalogue is thus at all times available.

A list is appended to the Catalogue of periodical publications received regularly for the Reading-rooms.

LIBRARY REGULATIONS

THE Library is intended for reference and not for circulation ; but for convenience of reference, a Member of the Society of Accountants in Edinburgh may borrow certain of the Books catalogued subject to the following conditions :—

- (1) No Book to be retained longer than three days. A fine of 1d. per day may be exacted for each day a book is kept beyond three.
- (2) Books to be lent out only on the receipt of the borrower, in a register kept in the Library for that purpose, or on the receipt of a messenger bearing a written order signed by the borrower.
- (3) Members losing or injuring or defacing any book by writing or otherwise, to supply another copy of the work, or to pay such sum as the Library Committee may determine by way of compensation.

Law Reports and other Books of Reference, Books or Periodicals forming part of a series, and rare Books, will not, under any circumstances, be allowed out of the Library.

Apprentices of Members of the Society are not allowed to borrow any of the Books, but they may consult them in the Library.
