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### THE BELLUM CIVILE OF PETRONIUS

#### INTRODUCTION

In discussing any part of the work of Petronius. we are hampered at the outset by uncertainty as regards the identity of the author. The author His Satirae 1 are not mentioned by any writer prior to the second century A.D.,2 and even then, although repeatedly cited by grammarians, as Petronius, Petronius Arbiter, or Arbiter alone,<sup>3</sup>
