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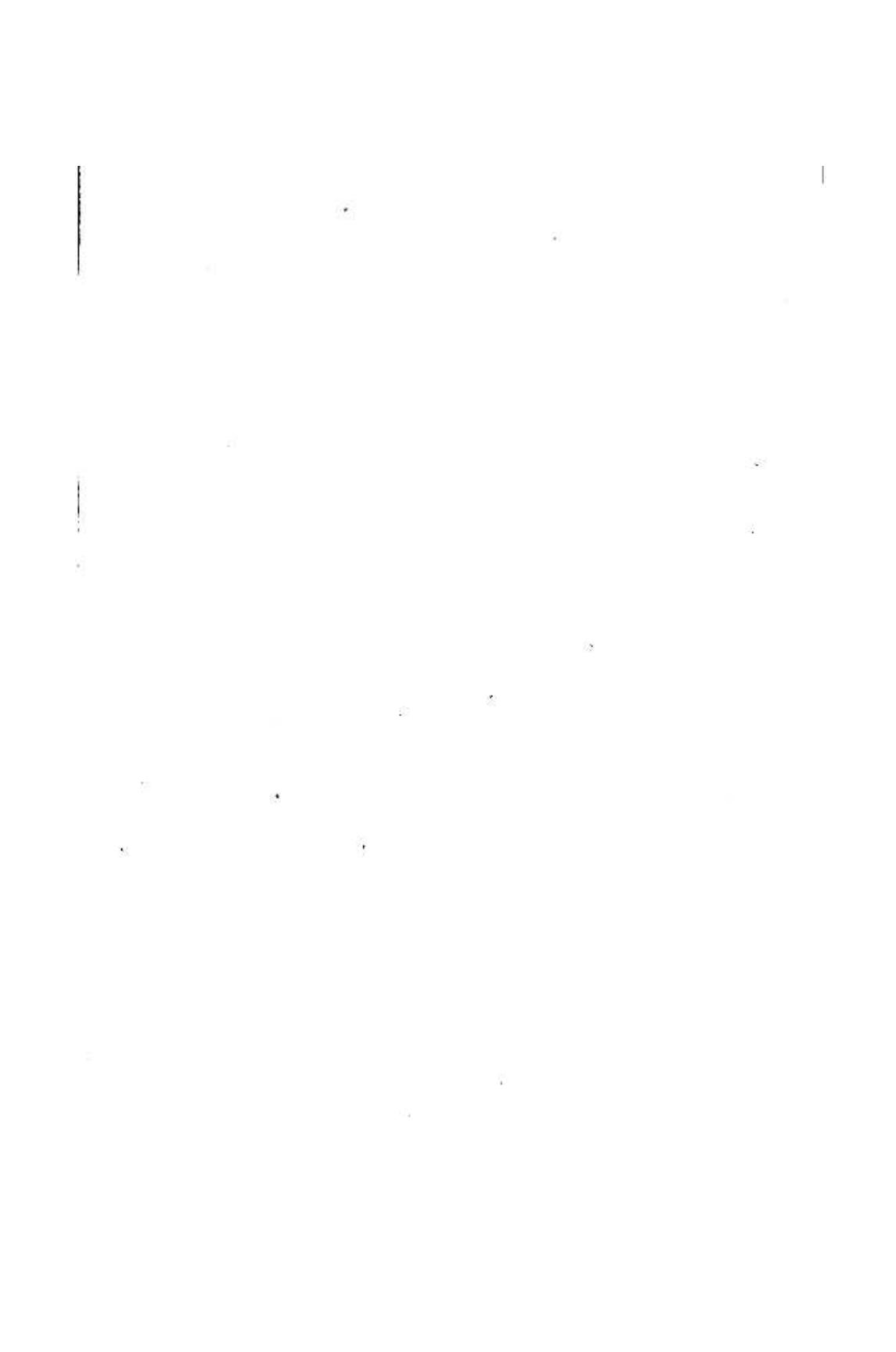
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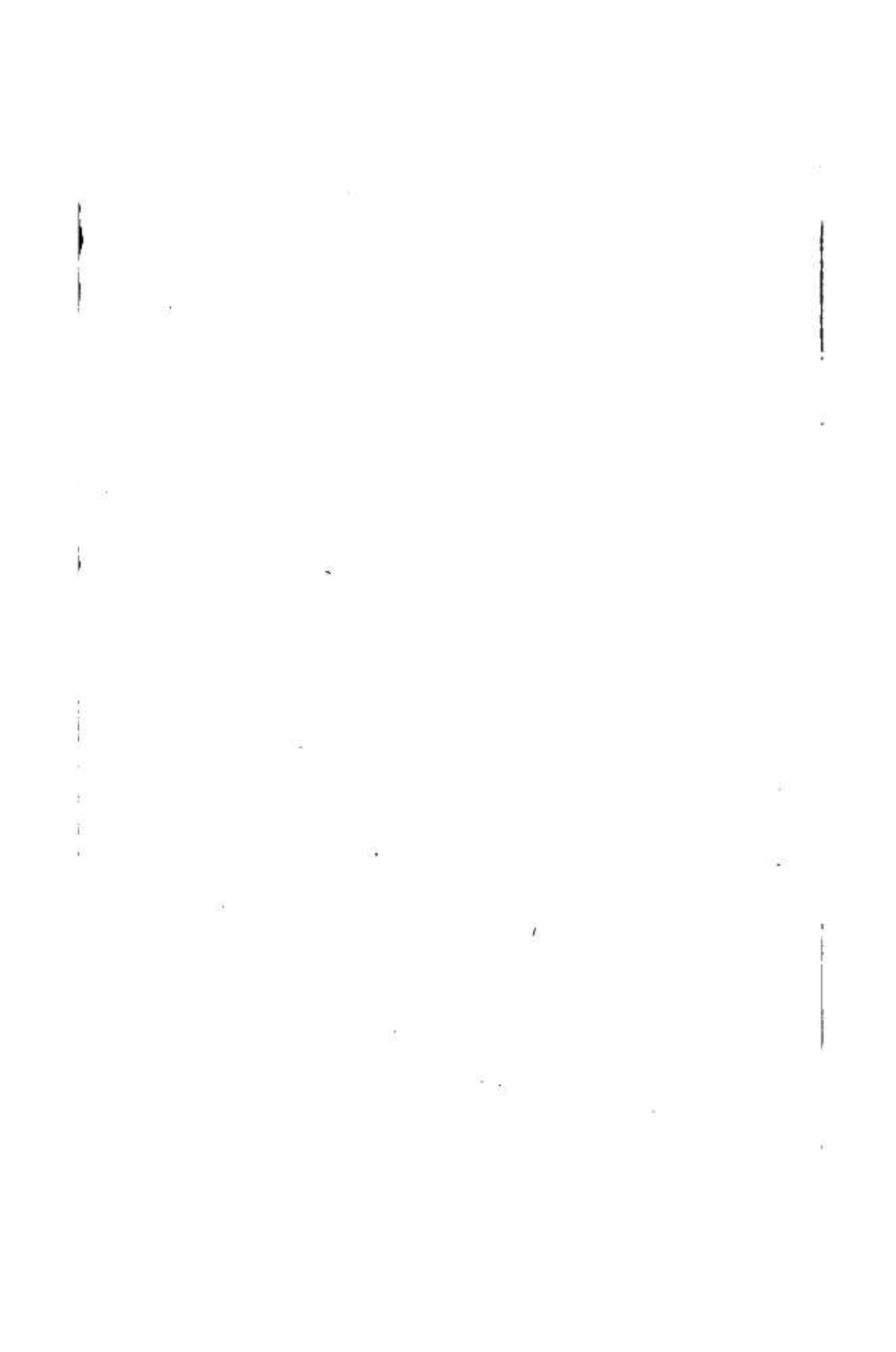
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PREFACE



PREFACE

HE essence of Christianity, as is now more and more realised, is in the personality of Christ. Within a generation after his life on earth ended, that personality began to be involved in and clouded over by the imperfect and often mistaken interpretations which slowly crystallised into a formal theology. To pierce through these accretions to the central life which has never ceased to burn within them, and so to bring that life into direct contact with our own, is to know Christ; and to know him, as he himself seems never to have been tired of repeating, is to know God. "If you had known me, you should have known my Father also; and from henceforth you do know him." Nor is this knowledge merely scientific or historical. It rises into what Plato would have called the world of ideas, a world immaterial and eternal, not expressed under the forms of space and time. Its unity
