#### PREFACE.

SHORTLY after the very successful visit of the British Archæological Association to Glasgow in the autumn of 1888, it occurred to a few of those who had taken an active interest in the work of the Congress, that if the reports of the meetings and excursions which had appeared from day to day in the columns of the Glasgow Herald were reprinted, the volume would form not only a pleasant memento of the Congress, but a useful guide to most of the interesting antiquities in the neighbourhood of Glasgow.
