THE Political Economy Club was founded in London in the year 1821, chiefly by the exertions of the late Thomas Tooke, F.R.S.

From the date of foundation to the year 1850, the meetings of the Club were held at the Freemason's Tavern, Great Queen Street. From 1850 to 1861, they were held at the Thatched House Tavern, St. James's Street; from 1861 to 1867, at the St. James's, 71, Quadrant, Regent Street; and since that time, at Willis's Rooms, King Street, St. James's Square.

The Club usually meets on the first Friday in each month from December to July, both inclusive, but omitting January, in which month there is no meeting.
