#### PREFATORY NOTE

THE papers collected into this volume were written separately and for immediate publication at intervals during the last three years. Therefore they are not linked together by any deliberate scheme. Nevertheless, they are put Yorward as having an element of unity; as representing phases in the development of a point of view which may be of some interest, even though the interest be largely retrospective and historical; and as affording, at least, the material for the diagnosis of a movement of mind which is, I am persuaded, not wholly personal. For this reason I have been careful to present them in the order in which they were written. A more logical arrangement would, perhaps, have been possible, seeing
