(Part II)

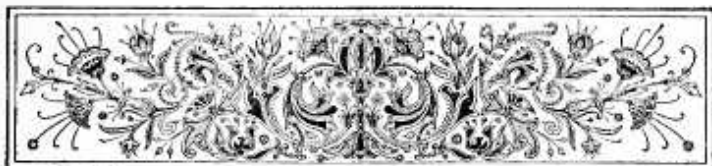
