The Society deliver gratis to Members within three miles of the Agent's residence, and it is a role must strictly adhered to, that No took shall be delivered until the Subscription is paid. Council-it having been deemed desirable to issue occasional volumes thus formed and entitled, in order to create a medium for preserving and distributing illustrations of the literature, which is the peculiar object of the Society.
