REPORT OF STATE TREASURER.

Columbia, S. C., January 9, 1907.

Hon. A. W. Jones, Comptroller-General.

Sir: I have the honor to submit my Annual Report of the transactions of this department for the fiscal year beginning January 1, and ending December 31, 1906.

It gives me pleasure to say that the State borrowed for the current year only three hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars, which is seventy-five thousand dollars less than was borrowed in 1905.

Owing to the stringency of the money market in New York, a little higher rate of interest had to be paid than for the previous year, and on account of tardiness in the payment of taxes, one note had to be renewed for fifteen days.
