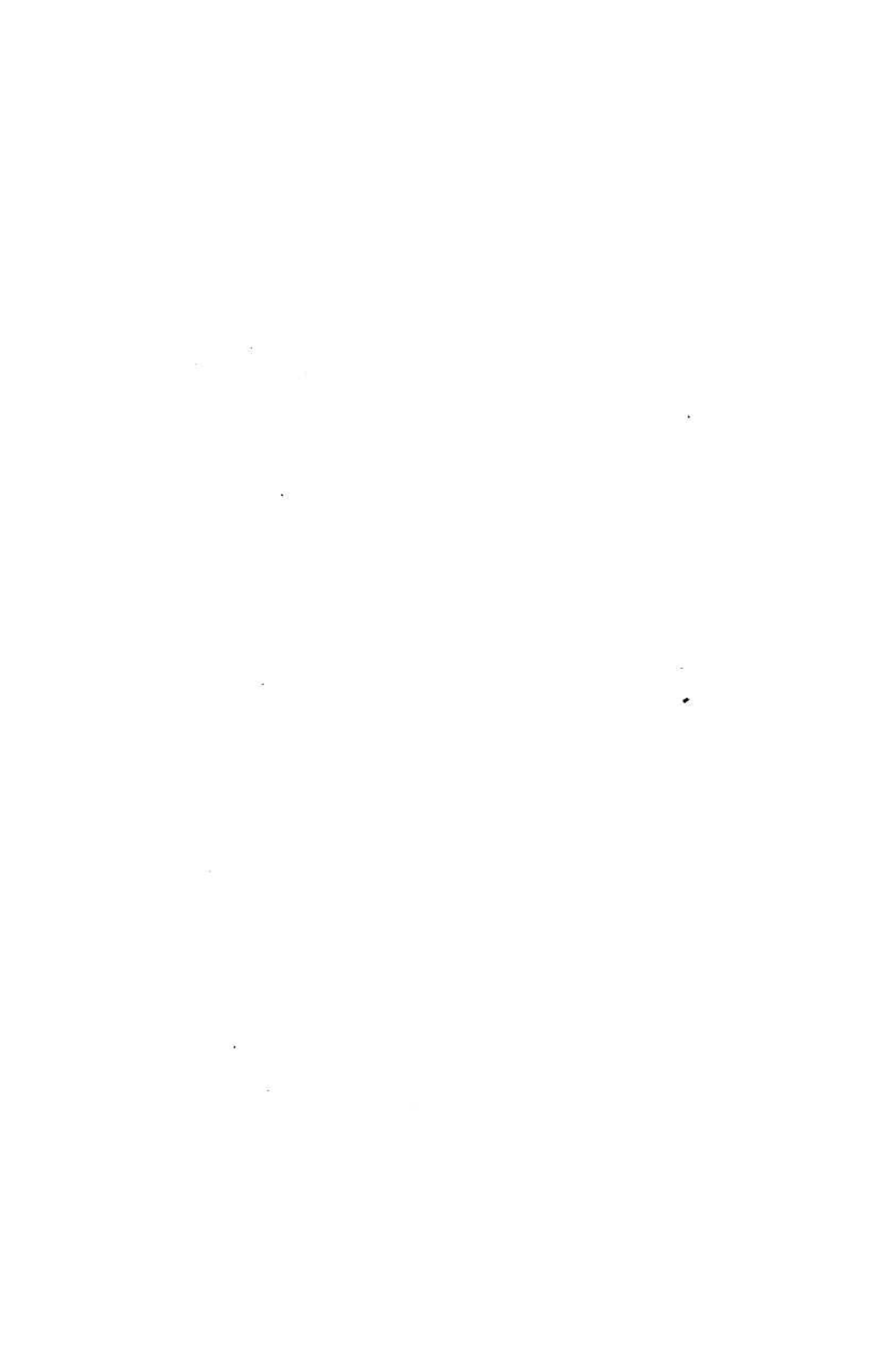

## ANNUAL REPORT.

---

*To His Excellency George T. Werts, Governor of New Jersey :*

SIR—I have the honor to submit herewith the fourth annual report of the State Board of Medical Examiners.

Two members of the Board died during the past year—Eugene Tiepler, of Orange, and George W. Brown, of Long Branch. The former was an examiner in Eclectic Materia Medica and Therapeutics and in Chemistry, and the latter in Obstetrics and Gynecology, as well as Secretary of the Board from October, 1893, until his death. Both of them were fit representatives of their respective schools, and faithfully performed their duties.

During the year ending July 3d, 1894, we examined (Appendix A) 130 candidates and issued 110 certificates to practice medicine and surgery in this State. Twenty candidates were refused a license, giving a percentage of rejections of 15.37 as compared with 22 per cent. in 1893, 24.47 in 1892, and 18.81 in 1891. As we are now working under an entirely new law, which went into effect on July 4th, 1894, it may be profitable to take a brief retrospect of the work done by the Board during our four years of existence. During this time—i. e. from July 4th, 1890—we have examined 524 candidates, including those taking their preliminary and final examinations as well as those re-examined, and we have issued 417 licenses (Appendix B); we have had repealed the charter of the Medical and Surgical College of New Jersey, at Jersey City, which was becoming a stench in the nostrils of the respectable members of the profession; we have secured the passage of a law regulating the practice of midwifery in this State, which has been in successful operation during the last two years; we have firmly impressed upon candidates that they must secure a good academic and medical education before they can obtain the right to practice in this State; we have elevated the standard of the medical profession, at least of the incoming members,

to a much higher grade than it ever reached before, and, finally, we have secured the passage of a new Medical law, approved by you May 22d, 1894, and became operative July 4th, 1894, which, without exception, is the best State Medical law in this country to-day, and if wisely and conservatively administered it will redound to the glory of those securing its enactment, and will be the pride of the medical profession of New Jersey in the future.

THE MIDWIFERY LAW.

During the past year we have issued thirty-one certificates to women to practice midwifery, making the number of two hundred and sixty-eight licensed midwives in this State. (See Appendix H.)
