INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

I HAVE compiled another volume of the Abridgment of the Cases which have been decided, and the Statutes which have been passed, on the subject of the laws for the relief of the poor, since the passing of the Poor Law Amendment Act in 1834, completing the series up to the end of the last year, and trust that it will prove of some use to the many persons now engaged upon that important subject. I have preserved the arrangement adopted in the first volume as nearly as the materials would permit, and now repeat that arrangement. The order is as follows:—

1. Those Cases which are applicable to the Powers of the Commissioners.
2. Those relative to the Guardians and Overseers.
3. To Parochial Property.
4. To the Poor Rate.
5. To the Maintenance of Bastards.
6. To the Relief and Removal of Paupers.
7. To the Settlement of Paupers.
8. To the Practice on Appeals.
9. Evidence.

Lastly. The Statutes passed during the last two years.
