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PREFACE.

This book is a revision of my Appendix to Bennett's Latin Grammar, published in 1895. That book was originally prepared as a series of lectures to advanced students on subjects not covered in any Latin Grammar published in America. The title "Appendix," however, was inisleading and gave to many a wrong impression of the purpose and scope of the book, which was in reality written long in advance of the publication of my Latin Grammar and entirely without reference to that work. The new title is more appropriate to the views discussed and the facts brought out; hence the change.

In the revision some dozen pages of old matter have been omitted, while nearly forty pages of new matter have been introduced; but the general plan and scope of the book are unchanged.

I am indebted to Professor J. C. Rolfe, of the University of Pennsylvania, and to Professor Charles L. Durham, of Cornell University, for valuable suggestions made while the book was passing through the press.
