THE first ten Sermons in this Volume, though preached at intervals during a period of nine years, will be found to have a certain unity of subject, and to have reference mainly to some errors either of practice or opinion respecting the office and work of the Holy Spirit, which have occurred to the Author in the course of his ministry or of his reading. A Sermon was delivered between the third and fourth on "Repentance as a gift of the Holy Spirit," which would properly form part of the Series, and would have been inserted in its place, had it not been expanded in a course of Lent Lectures already published.¹ The eleventh Sermon was preached on Quinquagesima Sunday on one of the texts prescribed for that day by the terms of the benefaction of Mr. Masters: and the twelfth, though not delivered before the University, is added on account of the importance of the subject.
