
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
"But first I shall take this opportunity to observe, that in the First Common Prayer Book of King Edward VI., before every Collect, Epistle, and Gospel, there is a Psalm pointed, which contains something prophetical of the Evangelical History used upon each Sunday and Holyday, or is some way or other proper to the day, which from its being sung or said, while the Priest made his entrance within the rails of the Altar, was called Introitus or Introit. But in the second edition of King Edward's Book it was laid aside, though the reason they had for doing so, is not easily assigned; for it is very certain that the use of Introits to begin the Communion Office, was not only unexceptionable, but of great antiquity in the Church: Durand proving that they were taken into Divine Service before the time of S. Jerome." -Wheatly on the Common Prayer.
